

CHAPTER V

CONCLUSIONS AND SUGGESTIONS

This chapter provides conclusion related to the results of the research and suggestions from the writer regarding the future research in order to solve the problem, of compound words.

5.1 Conclusions

This research discusses about compound words in *Lio Aku* language. This research revealed the elements of compound words found in *Lio Aku* language. Those elements include nouns, adjective, verb and preposition. This study also attempts to discover the types of compound words frequently appear in *Lio Aku* Language they are headed compound and headless compound.

Even though not all the compound words in *Lio Aku* language discovered but in this research overall, there are 106 compound words in *Lio Aku* language which discovered in doing this research.

5.1.1 Elements of Compound Words in *Lio Aku* Language

In order to answer the first question here is the the elements discovered in the data. The research showed that there are 17 elements which form compound words and it is devided into three groups they are 8 element which form compound noun (they are noun+ noun, noun+ verb, verb+ noun, noun+ adjective, adjective+ adjective, verb+ verb, verb+ preposition, preposition+ verb). 5 elements which form compound verb (they are verb+ verb, verb+ noun, verb+ adjective, adjective+ verb, and preposition+ verb) and 4 elements which formed Compound adjective

(they are adjective+ adjective, adjective+ verb, noun+ adjective and noun + noun).

The result indicates that there is another possible pattern of compound which form compound as usual. Those elements are discovered in order to answer the first question in chapter one.

5.1.2 Types of Compound Frequently Appear in *Lio Aku* Language

In order to answer the result on the second research question which is about the types of compound frequently appear in *Lio Aku* language. The result of research proves that the most common type of compound frequently appear in *Lio Aku* language is headless compound specifically exocentric compound.

5.2 Suggestions

In line with the significance of the study and the result of the data analysis, some suggestion would be offered to many sides accordingly as shown in the following:

1. Practical Suggestion

The writer hopes that this research can be useful for for the native speakers of *Lio Aku* language in using their daily life interactions. And also for the teacher they aan teach English using this type of analysis especially compound in English.

2. Theoretical suggestion

By this thesis the writer hopes the students especially from *Lio Aku* speakers they can learn English easily.

3. Other Researchers

The writer hopes the other researchers they can investigate more compound words in Lio Aku language because there are so many compound which have not discovered yet. And also they can find out the other compound words from other language. And the writers also hopes for those who the next coming researchers, they can use this thesis as their previous study.
