

CHAPTER V

CONCLUSSION AND SUGGETIONS

5.1 Conclusion

The structure of compound words in Uab Meto reflects the unique characteristics of this language, which is rich in cultural meanings and the environment of its speakers. Compound words in Uab Meto can be formed through various word combinations, such as noun with noun, verb with noun, adjective with noun, and other forms of combination. Each combination creates a new meaning that cannot always be directly interpreted from its constituent words.

For example, the noun combination *Uis Neno* (God Jesus) shows a close relationship between the concept of divinity and natural elements like the sky, reflecting the religious perspective of the Uab Meto community. Likewise, the verb-noun combination *tnaoma tote* (to propose) not only describes an action but also reflects social and cultural values related to marriage in this community.

Compound words in Uab Meto also demonstrate how it evolves in describing daily life, nature, and traditions of its people. For instance, the term *atone meto* (Timorese) does not only refer to an ethnic identity but also contains a geographical meaning that reflects the dry conditions of the Timor region. Meanwhile, compound words such as *pah pinan* (world) illustrate how the Uab Meto people perceive the vastness of the world.

Furthermore, the structure of compound words in Uab Meto also functions to clarify or emphasize a quality or action. The adjective-verb combination *mepot maneno* (work hard) illustrates the intensity of labor, while "naetan keo" (run fast) emphasizes the speed of an action.

By understanding the patterns and structure of compound words in Uab Meto, we can better appreciate how this language reflects the culture, beliefs, and geographical and social conditions of its speakers. Further research on compound words in Uab Meto can help preserve this language and provide deeper insights into linguistic developments in the region.

Overall, compound words in Uab Meto are not just word combinations but also a reflection of the cultural values and worldview of its speakers. Therefore, documenting and conducting in-depth studies on the structure of these compound words is essential to maintaining the linguistic richness of Uab Meto in the face of changing times.

5.2 Suggestions
