

CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

5.1 Conclusion

The conclusion is based on the problem statement, objective, and the data analysis. There are several subjects–verbs and time markers in sentence construction of Dawan Language spoken in Baunuba Dialect.

5.1.1 The Forms of Subject–Verb Agreement in Dawan Language spoken in Baunuba Dialect.

After analyzing the data taken from the verbs *eat*, *drink*, and *see* in sentence construction of Dawan Language spoken in Baunuba Dialect., it can be concluded that there is subject–verb agreement in Dawan Language spoken in Baunuba Dialect. There are three kinds of subject-verb agreement in Dawan Language spoken in Baunuba Dialect.

- a. The subject-verb agreement occur in the different change sounds/ phonem of the verb. The example of this subject-verb agreement is shown in verb *eat* representing other verbs in Dawan Language spoken in Baunuba Dialect. Example: *Eat and Come*.
- b. In the first consonant of the final syllable of the verb *drink* representing other verb in Dawan Language spoken in Baunuba Dialect. Example: *Drink and Hungry*.
- c. The subject-verb agreement occur in the same form of verbs of all kinds of subject of verb *see* representing other verbs in Dawan Language spoken in Baunuba Dialect. Example: *See, hear, go, walk, run and thirst*.

5.1.2 The Time Markers Existing in Dawan Language spoken in Baunuba Village.

There are some time markers used in Dawan Language spoken in Baunuba Dialect. Those time markers include *fe* ‘still’, *oe* ‘while’, and *ain/akenainen* ‘already.’ The time markers are shown in certain lexicons with their different lexical meanings. The syntactic position of those time markers are various. They are placed after the subject and after the goal, after the subject, and after the goal.

5.1.3 The Bound Morpheme in Dawan Language Spoken in Baunuba Village.

After analyzing the data that taken from bound morpheme include the verbs *drink* and *hungry* in Dawan Language spoken in Baunuba Village it can be concluded that the bound morpheme found inflectional in DL spoken in Baunuba dialect consists of *miun*, *tiun*, *niun*, *namnah*, *mumnah*, *mimnah* and *tamnah*. They are word class of verb even though added with affixes. The bound morpheme of affixes on words from inflectional morpheme has 7 words.

5.2 Suggestion

Based on significance of the study and the result of data analysis a number of suggestion would be offered to the following sides.

1. The experts of Dawan Language spoken in Baunuba Dialect are suggested to be proud of having local language and have to keep up the originality of Baunuba Dialect.
2. The writer would like to suggest others to make the study on other types of Dawan Language of subject-verb agreement in aspect, mood, and diathesis.

3. The experts of linguistics and other related subjects are suggested to do a continued study or similar study to confirm and extend the linguistic evidence of subject–verb agreement of Dawan Language spoken in other parts of region.
