

CHAPTER V

Considering the data analysis in the previous chapter, the writer makes some conclusions to the readers as in following. Going in line with the conclusion, the suggestions are offered.

5.1 Conclusion

This chapter presents the conclusion of the study. It is like a summary of what has been found in the data analysis. In this research the writer found out Terms of Address in East Manggarai Dialect of Manggarai Language. They are terms of address used in family relationship/kinship term and terms of address used in non family relationship. In East Manggarai, the people always address someone based on their family relationship. East Manggarai society uses the forms of address to keep their relationship with other people. Some terms of address in family relationship that can be used in non family relationship. They include *Ene* “mother”, *Ema* “father”, *nara* “brother”, *weta* “sister “, *aze* “brother”. They used these term because the addresser have relationship with the addressee, their degree of familiarity in relation to each other.

East Manggarai society often use the terms of address in family relationship to address people who are unfamiliar. They can address people based on age and social status. In social status they address other people based on higher status, same and lower status.

5.2 Suggestion

Based on the result of this study, the writer would like to give some suggestions for the following person.

1. Other linguistics researchers are suggested to do the research on the same topic to confirm and to elaborate.
2. The East Manggarai people are suggested to keep speaking their language, especially the terms of address to keep good social relationship in communication.
